Mail: October 9, 2018

In-Person: October 16, 2018

How many ways can I register to vote



- **Online:** <https://registernevada.org/>
- You will need to provide your valid Nevada drivers license and social security number.
- **Mail & In-Person:** This must be filled out then brought in or sent to your County Clerk or Registrar of voters' Office OR your City Clerk's Office. Find the application at:

PS: 17 year olds can pre-register if they turn 18 by November 6, 2018

When do you need to update your registration?

- If you've moved, changed your name, or changed your political party affiliation
- Remember Nevada Federal/State Primary Elections are Closed so you can only vote for the party you registered with

What is Absentee Voting/ Voting by Mail?

- This allows you to vote by mail if you cannot vote in person on election day.
- You must complete and submit an Absent Ballot Request Form to the County Clerk/Registrar of Voters in the county where you are registered to vote.
