Important Dates

General Election: November 6, 2018

Voter Registration Deadline: October 16, 2018

Request for Absentee Ballot: October 30, 2018 by mail,
November 2, 2018 online

How many ways can I pre-register?



- **Online:** <https://turbovote.org/> **OR**
<https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/OnlineVoterRegistration/InstructionsStep1>
- You will need to provide a Maryland driver's license number or MVA ID card.
- If you do not have one, you can provide the last four digits of your SSN instead!
- **In Person & By Mail:** This must be completed 21 days before the election and sent to your local Board of Elections office.

Can I do same day registration on Election Day?

- While you cannot register on Election Day in Maryland, you can register during the early voting period.
- Go to an early voting center in your county and be sure to bring a document proving your address. The best way to do this is with your valid government issued ID with your current address printed on it.

What is Absentee Voting/ Voting by Mail?

- This allows you to vote by mail if you cannot vote in person on election day.

First time Voting on Election Day?

What to bring:

Some polling places will request ID for first-time voters.

- EX: Maryland driver's license or ID card, military ID, current utility bill, etc.
- If you don't have ID on you, don't worry! You can submit a provisional ballot and provide ID later.
